CO-OP[®] Annual Report April 2013 – March 2014

Purpose of Certification

- To promote, examine and maintain standards for the advancement of Organizational Ombudsman;
- To identify -- for organizational ombudsman practitioners, their organizations, and the public -- those organizational ombudsmen who have voluntarily sought and obtained certification;
- To increase visibility for Certified Organizational Ombudsman Practitioners;
- To acknowledge that there is a body of knowledge and experience required to be an organizational ombudsman practitioner, and that certification demonstrates that an individual has that knowledge and experience;
- To ensure consistent adherence to the key ethical values and Standards of Practice of the organizational ombudsman as defined by IOA; and
- To enhance the status and credibility of the profession and present a reliable image to the public.

CO-OP[®] Highlights from 2013-2014

- One new Board member was elected in November 2013, and another Board member was elected in May 2013 to fill a vacated seat.
- New Chairs were selected for the Professional Practices Committee, the Finance Committee, and the Nominating Committee.
- The CO-OP[®] examination was offered during two testing windows in 2013: in Spring 2013, 24 individuals took the examination, and in Fall 2013, 8 individuals took the examination.
- CO-OP^{*}'s Testing Company, Schroeder Measurement Technologies, conducted an Item Writing and Exam Approval Workshop with six CO-OP volunteers, which resulted in the creation of Exam Version #3.
- To date, 202 individuals have taken the certification examination, with an overall pass rate of 94%.
- To date, we have 111 certified ombudsmen, 11 of whom became certified in the past year.
- Of the 111 certified individuals, we have certified 18 ombudsmen who practice in 12 countries outside of the US, including:

 - o Canada
 - o Chile
 - o China
 - o France

- o Netherlands
- o Switzerland
- Thailand
- United Kingdom

- To date, 14 individuals have been recertified.
- In 2013, CO-OP^{*} finished the year with a surplus of approximately \$7,900, making this the third year where CO-OP^{*} has made a profit for IOA.
- Lastly, in 2013, the Founder and Inaugural President of the CO-OP[®] Program, Marsha Wagner, retired from her organizational ombudsman role and, consequently, from the CO-OP[®] Board. We acknowledge Marsha with our deepest gratitude for all of her work to establish the Board of Certification for Certified Organizational Ombudsman Practitioners!

Goals for 2014-2015

- Continue recertification process with some fine-tuning to solidify a consistent process;
- Continue the development and planning of an office accreditation program;
- Apply for CO-OP[®] to become accredited by the National Commission for Certifying Agencies (NCCA)
- Implement additional marketing efforts to increase the number of individuals who take the CO-OP^{*} examination, and the number of individuals who become certified.
